FRIENDS FOR ANIMALS RECEIVES 3,000 VACCINES FROM COMMUNITY CARE GRANT THROUGH BANFIELD FOUNDATION®

Dearborn, MICH. March 10, 2025 – Banfield Foundation's Community Care Grant has been granted to Friends for Animals as an in-kind donation of 1,000 Bordetella vaccines, 1,000 DAPP vaccines, and 1,000 Rabies vaccines. These vaccines will be used to vaccinate animals at free clinics throughout the year.

Two free vaccine clinics have already been scheduled in partnership with Michigan Anti Cruelty Society, Oliver's Foundation, Dog Aide, Friends of Detroit Animal Care and Control, Feline Fund and Waggin' Tails, offering free DAPP, Lepto, Rabies, Bordetella, microchipping, and Dearborn and Detroit dog licensing. Dearborn, Detroit and Hamtramck residents will be invited to attend the free clinic, Sunday, May 4, from 2 – 5 p.m. at Michigan Anti-Cruelty Society, located at 13569 Joseph Campau Ave, Detroit, MI 48212.

Dearborn and Detroit residents are then invited to attend the Sunday, September 7 free clinic, at Friends for Animals' MaryAnn Wright Animal Adoption and Education Center, located at 16121 Reckinger Road, Dearborn, MI 48126, from 2 – 5 p.m., also offering free DAPP, Lepto, Rabies, Bordetella, microchipping, and dog licensing.
